

# IWR joins discussion at Cornell symposium on current outlook for refugee pathways

On December 3rd, IWR's Executive Director Casey Verderosa spoke on a panel at a public symposium at Cornell titled Refugee Pathways: Upstate NY & Beyond. Around 50 people took part in the event, which was organized as part of Cornell's Refugee Pathways and Resettlement Policy course with support from the Mellon Foundation. The symposium opened with a thought-provoking talk by author Heba Gowayed on her book *Refuge: How the State Shapes Human Potential*. The panel, which included representatives of local resettlement agencies as well as IWR, addressed questions on the post-election landscape for refugee resettlement in upstate NY. Discussion continued with insightful presentations from student groups working with community partners on refugee pathways and resettlement policy, and a keynote address by Lindsay Jenkins, Senior Advisor for Population, Refugees and Migration at the U.S. Department of State. A recurring theme from the panel discussion was the value of partnership and information-sharing

between community actors as we navigate policy changes brought by the new federal administration.
