'Know Your Rights' presentations

Out of an abundance of caution and in light of the incoming administration's desire to deport large numbers of immigrants, including those legally residing in the US, IWR held the first of several 'Know Your Rights' presentations for IWR families and individuals on January 4.

Twenty-three of IWR's refugee partners attended the session, from four language groups, and translators were present. Among other advice, attendees were informed about their rights under the US constitution should they come into contact with an Immigration and Customs Enforcement officer, which documents to carry with them at all times to prove they are legally allowed to be in the US, and how to contact an attorney should they be detained.

IWR. For the second year in a row, South Sudan is at the top of the International Rescue Committee's Emergency Watchlist; circumstances for women are especially desperate, as instances of gender-based violence are soaring.
