

IWR Crisis Fund Appeal Renewed to Help Grieving Family Secure Justice

Ithaca Welcomes Refugees is launching an <u>appeal for donations</u> to help a refugee family seek justice for their father and husband, who was killed in a traffic accident last year.

In July 2023, we created a Crisis Fund to help people served by IWR in times of exceptional need, following the tragic passing of a man from Afghanistan, whom we had helped to resettle locally with his wife and four school-aged children just weeks earlier. The family was left without an income, but thanks to generous donations from community members, we have been able to support them with critical expenses.

Unfortunately, no resolution has come of an official investigation into the accident that led to this family's loss. They now seek to pursue a civil case against the driver of the vehicle involved, helped by a local lawyer who is working with them pro bono. IWR aims to raise \$5,000 to cover the legal costs of proceeding with the case. Can you help?
